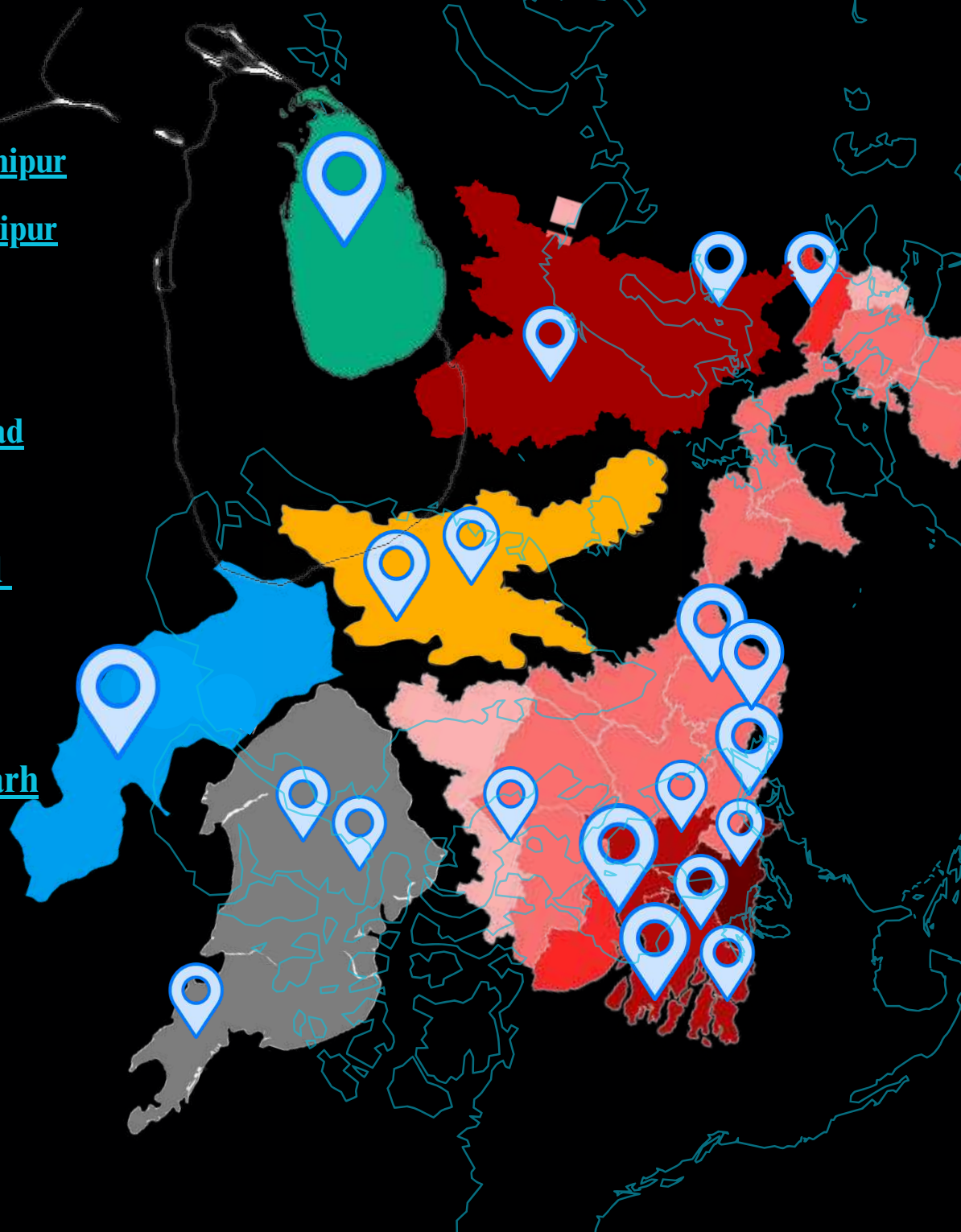

INTRODUCTION

the Kolkata Society for Cultural Heritage (KSCH), founded in 2013, is a social enterprise committed to promoting sustainable development and preserving the cultural heritage of rural, urban, and tribal communities across India. Our mission is to empower underserved populations, with a particular focus on women, by addressing social challenges through community-driven programs and environmentally responsible initiatives. KSCH's work encompasses sustainable livelihoods, environmental protection, education, healthcare, and the preservation of cultural traditions, with significant efforts in various regions of the country. At KSCH, we believe that economic independence is essential for lasting community development. Through initiatives such as self-help groups (SHGs), support for traditional arts and crafts, and environmental projects like the Mangrove Community Forest Movement, we aim to create meaningful opportunities while protecting natural resources. Since 2023, KSCH holds Special Consultative Status with the UN Economic and Social Council, reflecting its credibility and international engagement. Our dedication to impactful change was recognized in 2020 when KSCH received the Chanakya Award for NGO of the Year from the Public Relations Council of India.

INTEGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE: HIMALAYAN VILLAGE ADOPTION, KURSEONG

As part of its commitment to sustainable and inclusive development, KSCH undertook the adoption of a remote Himalayan village in Kurseong, Darjeeling, home to nearly 200 families. This initiative reflects a holistic approach to rural transformation, combining livelihood enhancement, infrastructure development, and cultural preservation.

Key interventions during the reporting period included the construction of livestock sheds to strengthen income-generating activities, alongside targeted community capacity-building programmes aimed at improving local skills and self-reliance. In parallel, KSCH initiated efforts to restore and revitalise community spaces, ensuring the preservation of the village's cultural identity and traditional practices.

To address critical infrastructural challenges, solar-powered street lighting systems were installed, significantly improving safety, accessibility, and overall quality of life. These measures have also contributed to mitigating issues such as human-wildlife conflict in the region.

Looking ahead, KSCH envisions the development of the village as a model hub for sustainable rural tourism. This forward-looking approach seeks to create long-term economic opportunities while safeguarding the ecological balance and cultural integrity of the community.

EXPANDING ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE: STRATEGIC INTERVENTIONS IN ODISHA

KSCH achieved a significant milestone by extending its impact beyond its home state, ensuring uninterrupted medical services across seven district hospitals in Cuttack, Odisha. This large-scale initiative has improved access to free, reliable healthcare for nearly 5.2 million rural residents by addressing critical gaps in medical infrastructure. Through sustained operational support, KSCH has strengthened the efficiency and continuity of healthcare delivery in underserved regions, enhancing both accessibility and quality of care. Anchored in a collaborative approach with the Government of Odisha's Health Department, the initiative is designed to establish a scalable, partnership-driven model for long-term, sustainable healthcare impact.



ENSURING ACCESS TO SAFE DRINKING WATER: COMMUNITY WATER PURIFICATION INITIATIVE

KSCH established a water purification plant in Jharkhali, Sundarbans, to address the pressing need for safe and clean drinking water in remote communities. The initiative currently benefits over 4,289 residents, significantly reducing their dependence on contaminated water sources and mitigating associated health risks.

Designed as a sustainable intervention, the project was implemented in close collaboration with local authorities and partner organisations to ensure long-term reliability and community ownership. By introducing a dependable source of potable water, KSCH has not only improved daily living conditions but also contributed to better public health outcomes in the region.

Beyond immediate impact, the initiative plays a crucial role in strengthening community resilience and supporting overall well-being. It reflects KSCH's continued commitment to addressing fundamental needs through practical, scalable, and sustainable solutions that enhance both accessibility and quality of life for underserved populations.

ECOLOGICAL RESTORATION AND WATER SECURITY: SUSTAINABLE POND REVIVAL IN THE SUNDARBANS

KSCH undertook a comprehensive pond restoration initiative in the Sundarbans to address the growing challenges of saline intrusion and water pollution. Through systematic cleaning and desilting of affected ponds, the project successfully revived their ecological balance and improved water quality for community use.

To ensure long-term sustainability, the initiative integrated rainwater harvesting systems and solar-powered water purification units. These measures have enhanced the availability of safe and reliable water, reducing dependence on contaminated sources and improving public health outcomes.

Beyond its environmental impact, the project has also generated livelihood opportunities for local Self-Help Groups, fostering economic stability within the community. By combining ecological restoration with income generation and sustainable technologies, KSCH has strengthened community resilience and created a replicable model for integrated rural development in vulnerable regions.

EMPOWERING PEOPLE, TRANSFORMING LIVES

KSCH, in collaboration with Coal India Limited and its partner organisations, proudly hosted an exhibition-cum-sale at the CIL Atrium — a vibrant showcase of creativity, resilience, and sustainable innovation. The event spotlighted a diverse range of upcycled products crafted from solid waste by underprivileged women representing 69 Self-Help Groups across Bengal. Beyond displaying finished goods, the event featured live demonstrations that offered visitors a firsthand glimpse into the artisans' craft, fostering meaningful connections between buyers and the makers behind each product.

This initiative reflects KSCH's deep commitment to the vision of Aatma Nirbhar Bharat — building a self-reliant India from the grassroots up. What began as a modest effort supporting 38 marginalised women has grown into a transformative movement, now empowering over 1,850 women through structured skill development programs and sustainable market linkages. By creating platforms that bridge talented artisans with wider markets, KSCH continues to champion economic independence, dignity, and long-term livelihood opportunities for women across underserved communities.

SCHOOL KIT DISTRIBUTION

KSCH successfully carried out a school kit distribution initiative at Juludih Primary School in Purulia, extending meaningful support to children from underprivileged communities. Each student received a carefully assembled set of essential supplies — including school bags, notebooks, stationery, shoes, and other basic necessities — helping to remove everyday barriers that often stand between a child and their education.

Beyond meeting immediate needs, this initiative sparked a renewed sense of enthusiasm and confidence for learning among the students. By ensuring that children have the tools they need to participate fully in school, KSCH helped create a more supportive and enabling environment for growth.

KSCH remains steadfast in its commitment to improving access to quality education and nurturing the potential of every young learner. Through such grassroots efforts, the organisation continues to invest in the futures of children who need it most.

BLOOD DONATION CAMP

On 5th September 2025, a Blood Donation Camp was jointly organised by Aria Rabindra & Abhilasha Complex, in collaboration with the Kolkata Society for Cultural Heritage (KSCH) and Ruby General Hospital. The event brought together community members, volunteers, and medical professionals in a shared act of compassion and civic responsibility.

This initiative served as a powerful reminder that donating blood is one of the simplest yet most impactful ways to save lives. Every unit of blood donated has the potential to make a critical difference for patients in urgent need. Beyond the medical impact, the camp fostered a strong sense of community solidarity, encouraging individuals to look out for one another and contribute to the greater good.

By bringing together multiple organisations under one roof, the event demonstrated the strength of collaborative action in addressing public health needs. KSCH's involvement reflects its broader commitment to community well-being — going beyond social development to actively support healthcare initiatives that protect and uplift lives at the grassroots level.

CRICKET BEYOND BARRIERS: CELEBRATING ABILITY, INCLUSION, AND SPORT

The Kolkata Society for Cultural Heritage (KSCH) played a proud and meaningful role in a special T20 Cricket Match featuring differently-abled players from the West Bengal Cricket Association for the Differently Abled (WBCADA). The match was held at the iconic Rajasthan Club, Maidan, on Sunday, 7th December, drawing together athletes, supporters, and community members in a celebration of talent and determination.

The event was organised by Skål International Kolkata, in collaboration with the British Deputy High Commission Kolkata and WBCADA — a powerful coalition of organisations united by a shared belief in the transformative power of sport.

KSCH's active participation helped amplify the spirit of inclusion and empowerment that defined the occasion. By shining a spotlight on the extraordinary abilities of differently-abled athletes, the match challenged stereotypes and reminded audiences that sport transcends physical limitations. It served as a living example of how athletic platforms can drive social integration, foster mutual respect, and bring communities closer together.

Through its involvement, KSCH reaffirmed its commitment to building an inclusive society — one where every individual, regardless of ability, is seen, celebrated, and given the opportunity to shine.

CYCLING CHAMPIONSHIP

The 45th West Bengal State Road Cycling Championship was held under the leadership of WBCA President Rajib Mehara and Secretary Abhijit Sett, with seamless organisation by the West Bengal Cycling Association. This year's edition was hosted in Nadia — a deliberate choice aimed at bringing the spotlight to district-level rural cyclists and providing them with a prestigious platform to showcase their talent and determination.

The championship drew participants and supporters from across the region, reflecting the growing enthusiasm for cycling as both a competitive sport and a vehicle for community pride. By hosting the event at a district level, the organisers took a meaningful step towards making competitive cycling more accessible and inclusive for athletes beyond urban centres.

KSCH's involvement in the championship aligns with its ongoing commitment to sustainability and environmental responsibility. By actively promoting cycling as a mode of green transportation, KSCH seeks to raise awareness about eco-friendly mobility and inspire communities to embrace healthier, more sustainable lifestyles. Sport, in this context, becomes a powerful medium for driving positive environmental change — one pedal stroke at a time.



YOUTH ART WORKSHOP

Art and culture are powerful forces in shaping the younger generation. They nurture creativity and emotional intelligence, encouraging young minds to think beyond boundaries while deepening their sense of identity and empathy. Through artistic expression, youth gain confidence, learn to channel their emotions constructively, and grow into agents of positive change in their communities.

The initiative was designed with a clear and heartfelt purpose — to inspire creativity, foster harmony, and instil a sense of cultural pride in the next generation. By bringing together children from diverse backgrounds under one roof, the workshop served as a bridge between communities, strengthening the social and cultural fabric of society through the universal language of art.

These events play a vital role in preserving Bengal's intangible cultural heritage — ensuring that age-old crafts, music, and traditions are not lost to time, but celebrated and passed on with pride.



ROOTED IN PURPOSE: KSCH'S ANNUAL MANGROVE PLANTATION DRIVE IN THE SUNDARBANS

Every year, the Kolkata Society for Cultural Heritage (KSCH) reaffirms its deep commitment to environmental stewardship through its annual mangrove plantation drive in the Sundarbans — one of the world's largest and most ecologically vital mangrove ecosystems. This year was no exception, as KSCH led the initiative in collaboration with PWC, planting hundreds of thousands of mangrove saplings along the fragile coastlines and riverbanks of the Sundarbans.

The significance of this effort cannot be overstated. Mangroves serve as a natural shield against soil erosion, protecting the land from the relentless forces of tidal surges and coastal flooding. They play a critical role in strengthening embankments, buffering vulnerable communities from the devastating impacts of cyclones and rising sea levels. Beyond their protective function, mangrove forests are powerful carbon sinks — quietly absorbing greenhouse gases and serving as one of nature's most effective weapons against global warming.

What makes KSCH's plantation drive truly distinctive is the human story woven into it. The mangrove saplings are not sourced from distant suppliers — they are carefully nurtured in local nurseries by women from the Sundarbans communities, as part of KSCH's broader women empowerment programme. This approach ensures that the environmental mission and the social mission walk hand in hand — giving local women a meaningful source of income, a sense of ownership, and a direct stake in the health of their ecosystem.

With every sapling planted, KSCH is not merely restoring a forest — it is rebuilding hope, reinforcing livelihoods, and protecting the future of one of India's most precious natural treasures.



ADVOCACY & AWARENESS

Raising awareness and inspiring collective action lie at the very heart of KSCH's mission. The organisation firmly believes that lasting change begins with informed communities — people who understand the challenges they face and feel empowered to act.

Through impactful campaigns focused on climate change in the Sundarbans, KSCH brings critical environmental issues to the forefront, highlighting the urgent challenges faced by one of the world's most ecologically sensitive regions. These campaigns not only educate but also mobilise communities to take proactive steps in protecting their natural environment.

Beyond environmental advocacy, KSCH marks key global observances — including World Bicycle Day, World Environment Day, and International Yoga Day — to promote sustainable, healthy, and mindful ways of living. Each of these occasions serves as an opportunity to engage the public in meaningful conversations about their relationship with the planet and with themselves.

From community tree plantations and eco-art to cultural performances celebrating Earth Day, KSCH continues to weave advocacy seamlessly into culture and creativity — proving that awareness, when paired with action, has the power to transform communities and protect the world we share.

The Grace Island Initiative marks KSCH's first significant step beyond India's borders — representing the organisation's international expansion into Sri Lanka. It carries KSCH's core vision of sustainable development, women's empowerment, and community upliftment to a new geography, demonstrating that the values driving change in Kolkata are universal in their reach and relevance.

On the ground, Grace Island is actively partnering with local communities through thoughtfully designed programs spanning three vital areas: human rights advocacy, environmental protection, and livelihood development. Together, these pillars form a holistic framework aimed at empowering women, supporting vulnerable groups, and building communities that are resilient and self-sustaining.

More than just an initiative, Grace Island has grown into a dynamic platform for impact, collaboration, and cultural exchange. By fostering deeper ties between communities across the region, it is helping to build bridges of mutual understanding and shared purpose — laying the foundation for meaningful, long-term change that transcends borders.

SWACHHATA HI SEVA

In a proud demonstration of civic responsibility and community spirit, the Kolkata Society for Cultural Heritage (KSCH), in collaboration with Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), actively participated in the Government of India's Swachhata Hi Sewa mission — organising a large-scale cleanliness drive at the iconic Puri Sea Beach.

The initiative brought together a diverse and enthusiastic group of participants, united by a shared commitment to a cleaner, greener India. School children, college students, local traders from the Puri Sea Beach market, and members of the surrounding communities came forward in remarkable numbers, lending their time, energy, and enthusiasm to the cause. Their collective participation transformed the drive into far more than a cleanliness exercise — it became a powerful statement of community ownership and environmental responsibility.

From KSCH's perspective, this initiative represented a meaningful alignment of cultural values and environmental action. By mobilising diverse sections of society — from schoolchildren to local vendors — the drive reinforced the belief that true and lasting change is only possible when entire communities come together with a shared sense of purpose.

KSCH remains committed to supporting such grassroots missions and will continue to partner with like-minded organisations to build cleaner, more conscious, and more responsible communities across India.

LIGHTING THE WAY: KSCH'S SOLAR STREET LIGHT INITIATIVE IN THE SUNDARBANS

In a region where darkness once fell heavy and early, the Kolkata Society for Cultural Heritage (KSCH), in collaboration with PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC), has brought light — quite literally. Together, they successfully installed 50 solar-powered street lights across the Kultali area of the Sundarbans, directly benefiting over 8000 people across 2 villages.

The Sundarbans presents unique challenges for its communities, most notably the ever-present threat of man-animal conflict. The lack of adequate lighting after dusk leaves villagers dangerously exposed to wildlife. The solar street lights have created a vital safety barrier, giving residents the freedom and confidence to move through their surroundings after dark.

Beyond safety, the initiative has meaningfully improved everyday life — allowing children to study after sunset, supporting local businesses, and offering women and the elderly a greater sense of security. Powered entirely by solar energy, the project also ensures a clean, sustainable, and cost-free lighting solution perfectly suited to the Sundarbans.

This partnership between KSCH and PwC stands as a powerful example of how civil society and corporate responsibility can unite to transform the lives of some of West Bengal's most underserved communities — one light at a time.



KSCH – UNESCO RCCH PROGRAMME PERFORMING ARTS SEGMENT IMPLEMENTATION REPORT 2025–2026

ROLE OF KSCH AS IMPLEMENTATION PARTNER

As the implementation partner for UNESCO's Performing Arts segment under the RCCH Programme, KSCH undertook responsibilities including:

- Planning and execution of village-level cultural festivals.
- Identification and mobilisation of traditional artists and cultural practitioners.
- Coordination with local stakeholders and partner organisations.
- Community outreach and awareness-building.
- Documentation and promotion of traditional art forms.
- Facilitation of artist participation and audience engagement.
- Supporting women-led and community-based cultural initiatives.

KSCH's approach combined cultural preservation with community development, ensuring that traditional practices remained relevant and economically viable for future generations.

OVERVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

During the reporting period, KSCH organised and supported a wide range of activities under the RCCH Programme, including:

- Five village-level cultural festivals.
- Folk music and dance performances.
- Community cultural gatherings.
- Artisan showcases and exhibitions.
- Skill development and awareness initiatives.
- Cultural demonstrations and interactive sessions.
- Promotion of women-led Self-Help Groups.
- Public engagement programmes connecting artists directly with audiences.

These initiatives created platforms for cultural exchange and strengthened the visibility of local traditions.



VILLAGE FESTIVAL INITIATIVES

Under the UNESCO RCCH Programme, KSCH successfully organised five village festivals across different districts of West Bengal under the banners of SundaRhythm and MaatiRhythm. SundaRhythm was organised in Sandeshkhali, Sundarbans, and Hingalgunj, North 24 Parganas, celebrating the rich folk traditions and cultural heritage of the delta communities through performances, music, artisan participation, and community engagement. MaatiRhythm was organised in Nadia, Purulia, and Birbhum, highlighting the diverse folk traditions, indigenous cultural practices, music, dance, and storytelling traditions of rural Bengal. These festivals created vibrant platforms for local artists, artisans, and cultural practitioners while encouraging community participation and strengthening efforts toward preserving Bengal's intangible cultural heritage. The festivals featured a diverse range of traditional performing art forms including Chhau Dance, Baul & Fakiri, Jhumur, Bhawaiya, Gambhira, Domni, Bonbibir Pala, Raibenshe, Tribal Dance, String Puppetry, Khon, Mukha , and Chadar Badar, representing the rich cultural diversity of rural Bengal.



COMMUNITY IMPACT

The programmes implemented under the RCCH initiative generated significant social and cultural impact across participating communities. The village festivals and associated activities helped revive and sustain traditional performing arts while strengthening local cultural identity and encouraging active community participation. The initiatives created meaningful platforms for folk artists, artisans, and cultural practitioners to showcase their work and engage with wider audiences. The festivals also encouraged participation from women, youth, and rural communities, promoting intergenerational cultural exchange and greater community ownership of local traditions. Through these initiatives, KSCH contributed toward preserving Bengal's intangible cultural heritage while supporting grassroots cultural development.

The implementation of UNESCO's RCCH Programme by KSCH has demonstrated the transformative potential of culture-driven community development.
